## **EPA:** Lebanon joins the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe

Lebanon, the 35th Member State of the Enlarged Partial Agreement On the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe

February 15, 2022

The Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe (EPA) is pleased to welcome the Republic of Lebanon as a new EPA member State.

On 15 February, HE Mr. Walid NASSAR, Minister of Tourism, informed HE Mrs. Marija PEJČINOVIĆ BURIĆ, Secretary General of the Council of Europe, of the decision of the Republic of Lebanon to accede to the EPA as of 1 January 2022.

The Lebanese Council of Ministers in their meeting on February 10, 2022 have approved the EPA membership in accordance with the accession letter of the Ministry of Tourism of the Republic of Lebanon dated 15 November, 2021 to the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe (EPA). On February 18, 2022 ,During the International Conference on the Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe Crossing Italy: officially announced Lebanon , the 35 Member State of the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe.

The accession follows a Committee of Ministers' decision on the request of Lebanon to become a member of the EPA. An Enlarged Partial Agreement, the EPA is open to non-Council of Europe member States in accordance with Resolution CM/Res(2013)66 confirming the establishment of the Enlarged Partial Agreement on Cultural Routes (EPA). Lebanon becomes the 35th member State of the EPA.

Lebanon is currently crossed by 3 "<u>Cultural Routes of the Council of Europe</u>": the Phoenicians' Route, the Routes of El Llegado Andalusí, the Routes of the Olive Tree and soon will join the Wine Route.

THE PHOENICIANS' ROUTE: It refers to the connection of the major nautical routes used by the Phoenicians, since the 12th century BC, as essential routes for trade and cultural communication in the Mediterranean. Through these routes, the Phoenicians - genial sailors and merchants - and other great Mediterranean civilizations contributed to the creation of a "koiné", a Mediterranean cultural community, producing an intense exchange of manufactured articles, people and ideas.

ROUTES OF EL LEGADO ANDALUSI: In the 8th century, the Iberian Peninsula saw the arrival of Arabs and Berbers who mixed with the Roman-Visigoth inhabitants, engendering what was known as al-Andalus. This successful medieval Muslim civilization extended, at its peak, to most of what is today Spain and Portugal, until its downfall in the late 15th century.

ROUTES OF THE OLIVE TREE: The presence of the olive tree has marked not only the landscape but also the everyday lives of the Mediterranean peoples. As a mythical and sacred tree, it is associated with their rites and customs and has influenced their lifestyles, creating a specific ancient civilization, the "Olive Tree Civilization": the Routes of the Olive Tree follow in the footsteps of this civilization, from Greece towards the Euro-Mediterranean countries.

ITER VITIS ROUTE (THE WINE ROUTE): The culture of the vine, winemaking and viticulture landscapes are an important part of European and Mediterranean food culture. Since the domestication of the vine, several thousand years BC, its evolution and spread has been considered a great human achievement, which shaped Europe's landscapes, both in terms of its territory and its people.

### Heritage Archaeological Hinterland - Jabal Moussa - April 11, 2022

The Association for the Protection of Mount Mousa biosphere held a cultural ceremony in the presence of Judge Maya Kanaan, representatives of the Minister of Culture, The American Ambassador to Lebanon Dorothy K. Shea, Honorary President of the Phoenicians' Route, Professor Rachid Chamoun, President of a country that is jammed by Professor Carl Zwain, President and members of the Association for the Protection of Jabal Moussa and some local bodies crowned by Heritage Archaeological Hinterland project from the U.S. Embassy in Lebanon, through the Ambassadors Fund for the Preservation of Cultural Heritage AFCP program, and the launch of the Cultural Center, which will be a mountain centre for the Phoenicians' Route, as part of the EU-based CROSSDEV project under the ENI CBC MED programme.

The foundation stone of the cultural center was laid after the design was explained by Dr. Hani Qahwaji, whose design is in harmony with the site and is inspired by the tymbals.











### **Jbeil District Sustainable Tourism Vision - April 7-9, 2022**

The First Conference on Tourism for the district and city of Byblos concluded its works at the Lebanese American University (LAU) in Blat, Byblos, two days after it started, during which inputs were given and exchange of experiences were carried out by fifty participants, in the presence of more than three hundred people, in addition to many ministers, MPs, mayors, accredited ambassadors, experts, NGOs, tourism service providers, and stakeholders.


**Smart Ways Lebanon by the Phoenicians' Route**

### Future activities: Series of webinars and workshop starting June 2022

1. In preparation of the celebrations for the 50th anniversary of the UNESCO World Heritage Convention and in line with WATCH http://www.eyeonculture.net/ mandate in the field of Cultural and Natural Heritage protection, in continuity with the experience gained in the areas of Risk Preparedness Planning and Disaster Risk Reduction . LAU- Louis Cardahi Foundation in collaboration with the World Association Tangible and Intangible Cultural Heritage (WATCH), the Lebanese Ministries of Tourism and Culture propose to implement a number of factual activities to support the creation of independent heritage protection missions:

Organize and implement of six series of Webinars, starting June 2022, on Disasters Risk Reduction dedicated to the protection of the Lebanese World Heritage Sites (Cultural, Natural or Mixed). The webinars will be organised with the cooperation and direct involvement of International experts and Academicians with great experience.

The six sets of webinars will treat the following arguments:

W1\_Introduction to Disasters Risk Reduction for the protection of Cultural and Natural Heritage sites;

W2\_Progressive Cultural & Natural Heritage Classification and Documentation for operative application during emergency;

W3\_Movable Heritage Risk Reduction and Response Policies and Measures;

W4\_Immovable Heritage Risk Reduction and Response Policies and Measures;

W5\_DRR planning & implementing concrete measures to contrast the effects of catastrophic events;

W6\_Developing logistics for evacuation and sheltering to protect heritage in emergency. How to set safe haven for heritage under threat.

- Following the webinars we shall have international workshops and onsite training in Byblos and other heritage sites in Lebanon, entitled: Disasters Risk Reduction dedicated to the protection of the Lebanese World Heritage Sites.









### Future activities: international events starting September 2022 (Falls within 22/23 academic year budget)

- 2. EPA Governing Board, European Institute of Cultural Routes, Council of Europe to take place during the Annual Advisory Forum in Chania, Greece on 5-7 October 2022. (date confirmed) Tentative budget: travel and accommodation \$ 2,500
- 3. Co-organise a conference within the ED-ARCHMAT programme that was originally between September/October 2022. This activity is about to be defined. The conference should be co-organised as a STAC 9 together with other stakeholders; for the protection and promotion of Byblos. Engage faculty and students Budget for travel and accommodation for 6 people 6000 euros. Co-organise a conference in Venice 2022-2023 (TBA) to promote Byblos architectural and historical integrity/ authenticity and Byblos heritage within the Heritage for Peace network; (travel and accommodation for two people). In collaboration with the University of Venice, University of Bologna and LAU and others, (date to be confirmed). Proposed Budget \$11,900
- 4. Co-organize international exhibition and symposium of the Phoenicians' Route to encompass the twelve active partner countries within the Cultural routes of the council of Europe in collaboration with the UNESCO, the European institute of Cultural routes and to take place at the at the UNESCO facilities in Paris. (date to be confirmed)
