Aleph is inspired by the phoenician letter (★).
(A) in Latin, (i) in Arabic.
Aleph means ox, strength, leadership.



Lamed is inspired by the phoenician letter (ん). (L) in Latin, (し) in Arabic.
Lamed means ox-goad, sting.



Beth is inspired by the phoenician letter (う). (B) in Latin, (中) in Arabic. Beth means house, interiority.



Mem is inspired by the phoenician letter (מן). (M) in Latin, (ם) in Arabic.

Mem means water, movement.



Gimel is inspired by the phoenician letter (\uparrow). (C,G) in Latin, (\mathfrak{E}) in Arabic. Gimel means camel, pride.



Nun is inspired by the phoenician letter (り). (N) in Latin, (ט) in Arabic.
Nun means fish, snake, hidden.



Daleth is inspired by the phoenician letter (الله عند (D) in Latin, (٤٠٤) in Arabic.

Daleth means door, pathway, exteriority.



Samek is inspired by the phoenician letter (≢). (S, X) in Latin, (ω) in Arabic.
Samek means support, fishbone.



Hé is inspired by the phoenician letter (3). (E, H) in Latin, (4) in Arabic. Hé means window, breath, life.



Ayin is inspired by the phoenician letter (O). (O) in Latin, (¿ ¿) in Arabic.

Ayin means eye, see, experience.



Waw is inspired by the phoenician letter (Y). (F,U,V,W,Y) in Latin, () in Arabic.
Waw means nail, hook, secure.



Peh is inspired by the phoenician letter (2). (P) in Latin, (in Arabic.

Peh means mouth, word, opening.



Zayin is inspired by the phoenician letter (I). (Z) in Latin, (j) in Arabic.

Zayin means weapon, conflict.



Sadhe is inspired by the phoenician letter (\mathcal{V}). (S) in Latin, (ω) in Arabic. Sadhe means hook, capture.



Heth is inspired by the phoenician letter (\boxminus). (H) in Latin, ($\dot{\varsigma}$, $\dot{\varsigma}$) in Arabic. Heth means wall, fence, obstacle.



Qoph is inspired by the phoenician letter (Φ). (Q) in Latin, (\mathfrak{G}) in Arabic. Qoph means cut, break, monkey.



Teth is inspired by the phoenician letter (⊗). (T) in Latin, (ム・山) in Arabic.
Teth means unknown, shield, wheel.



Resh is inspired by the phoenician letter (¶). (R) in Latin, (ノ) in Arabic.
Resh means head, beginning.



Yodh is inspired by the phoenician letter (\mathcal{A}) . (I,J,Y) in Latin, (\mathcal{G}) in Arabic. Yodh means hand, command.



Shin is inspired by the phoenician letter (w). (S,SH) in Latin, (ﺵ) in Arabic. Shin means tooth, consume.



Kaph is inspired by the phoenician letter (\nearrow). (K) in Latin, (\trianglelefteq) in Arabic. Kaph means palm of hand, bend.



Taw is inspired by the phoenician letter (🗶). (T) in Latin, (ث، ث) in Arabic. Taw means mark, sign, connection.
